I play Yo juego	<b>Do</b> I play? ¿Juego yo?	I <b>do not</b> play Yo no juego
You play Tú juegas	<b>Do</b> you play? ¿Juegas tú?	You <b>do not</b> play Tú no juegas
He plays Él juega	<b>Does</b> he play? ¿Juega él?	He <b>does not</b> play Él no juega
She plays Ella juega	<b>Does</b> she play? ¿Juega ella?	She <b>does not</b> play Ella no juega
It plays Él/Ella juega	<b>Does</b> it play? ¿Juega él / ella?	It <b>does not</b> play Él / Ella no juega
We play Nosotros jugamos	<b>Do</b> we play? ¿Jugamos nosotros?	We <b>do not</b> play Nosotros no jugamos
